Short description:

Higher education institutions, together with their student and civil society networks, are critical partners for delivering transformative, equitable, and innovative action on the SDGs beyond a narrow “SDG 4 only” lens. This session highlights how universities, youth-led civil society, and SDG hubs are co-creating solutions for SDGs 6, 7, 9, 11, and 17 through place-based partnerships, futures thinking, and whole-institution approaches. A short keynote by a global youth governance leader will frame higher education as a societal actor responding to polycrisis, followed by case studies from an SDG 11 UN Academic Impact Hub university, an SDG 4 International Association of Universities HESD cluster university, and other global higher education networks. The session will foreground universities and local communities as co-creators of just and sustainable futures, and explore how ECOSOC processes can more effectively leverage these partnerships in the lead-up to 2030 and beyond.
